- 2 Aunt Polly, Tom Sawyer, (*Chapter 1*)/ Ben Rogers, Billy Fisher, (*Chapter 2*)/ the Minister, the girl with yellow hair (*Chapter 3*)/ Huckleberry Finn (*Chapter 4*)/ Becky Thatcher – the girl with the yellow hair, (*Chapter 5*).
- a lamp (Two of the ghosts were carrying lamps.)
 a knife (Injun Joe uses Muff Potter's knife to kill Doctor Robinson)
 a coffin (Injun Joe and Muff Potter dig up Hoss Williams' coffin.)
 a shovel (Injun Joe is carrying two shovels.)
 a piece of rope (Injun Joe is carrying a piece of rope.).
- 4 Student's own answer. Sample answer.
 (a) a cake: Tom took some cake to Jackson's Island.
 (b) a fishing line: Tom caught fish with Joe's fishing line.
 (c) some corn: Huck took some corn to Jackson's Island.
 (d) a cooking pot: Joe brought a cooking pot to

Jackson's Island.

(e) a steamboat: the people on the steamboat looked for the bodies of Tom, Joe and Huck in the water.

5 Student's own answer. Students should look at Chapter 6, particularly pages 27 to 30 for help in writing what Tom tells Muff Potter's lawyer.

Main details. Tom and Huck went to the graveyard with a dead cat because they believed that it could cure warts. They saw Injun Joe, Muff Potter and Doctor Robinson arrive sometime not long after midnight. Injun Joe and Muff Potter dug up the body of Hoss Williams for the doctor. The doctor and Injun Joe had an argument. The doctor hit Injun Joe. Muff attacked the doctor and they both fell to the ground. Joe picked up Muff's knife. The doctor hit Muff with a piece of wood. While he was doing this, Injun Joe stabbed the doctor.
